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Naturally, my first instinct is to engage and start a conversation with Doug but you just have to watch the short film to see that he was incredibly impatient and that he wants to trip us rather than positively influence design and rollout. He's a professional campaigner and never going to give us the thumbs up or any support. Stakeholders have reiterated that this will be always be the case with Doug. My advice is to keep our powder dry until we're in a position to give WP's a positive push.

If this does generate any media coverage we can easily rebut any concerns and detail the groups that support us.
